Re: Notice of Continuing Operations as a Manufacturer in a Critical Infrastructure Segment

To our Valued Customers and Suppliers:

Alger Precision Machining, LLC ("Alger") is aware that California Governor Newsom's Executive Order N-33-20 ordered all non-essential businesses to close effective March 19, 2020 ("Order"). Alger's operations are exempt from the Order's closure and travel restrictions because it is part of the essential critical infrastructure needed to maintain continuity of operations during the response to the COVID-19 emergency as outlined at <https://www.cisa.gov/identifying-critical-infrastructure-during-covid-19> ("Critical Sectors").

The Order provides that Californians working in the Critical Sectors may continue their work because of the importance of these sectors to Californians' health and well-being. The Critical Sectors include the Critical Manufacturing Sector. CISA explains that this Sector is crucial to the economic prosperity and continuity of the United States. CISA has issued a list of industries that fall within the parameters of the critical functions. The director of CISA has confirmed that the list is not a directive, but rather is advisory in nature. On March 22, 2020 further guidance was provided from the California State Public Health Officer regarding workers exempt from the Order. The guidance in relevant part provides with respect to the Critical Manufacturing Sector, the exemption is applicable for Workers necessary for the manufacturing of materials and products needed for medical supply chains, transportation, emergency services, the defense industrial base, among others.

Alger manufactures an extensive array of high volume, medium complexity precision metal components to exacting print specifications for materials and products in the medical, transportation and defense industrial base industries.

We have carefully considered the Order and the guidance available concerning the Critical Manufacturing Sector. We have consulted with our counsel, other manufacturers in our industry, and others whom we felt could offer meaningful insights as to our role in the Critical Sector. We have concluded that we have a responsibility to continue our operations in a normal capacity to the extent possible, while also employing work from home and other appropriate safety measures. We believe this action is consistent with the goals of the Order and the guidance from CISA and the California State Public Health Officer.

The safety of our people, our customers, and the community in which we operate are our top priorities. We will continue to closely monitor the latest COVID-19 updates and take all appropriate actions. We appreciate your cooperation and assistance as we work together to do our part during these unprecedented challenges.
